

Church Has Voted to Disaffiliate!!!!

Thursday, February 2nd, Robertsdale United Methodist Church voted by a vote of **97 to 4** to disaffiliate from the United Methodist Church at a Church Conference. At this time we ARE STILL United Methodist, until the final vote at Annual Conference **May 7th**.

The next steps in the process were discussed at a Joel Council meeting Monday night.

March 15th is the deadline for the paperwork to be completed and turned in to the Annual Conference for consideration by the Cabinet, the Conference Trustees and to be put on the agenda for the Annual Conference special called session May 7th to be voted on by the members of the Annual Conference. The Joel Council is working through the many steps to assure that happens.

Andy Smith is a lawyer in Mobile helping churches to file the paperwork with the state, and he is helping us pro-bono (without charge, except for filing fees). All we will have to do is get him the name change and the paperwork will be filed. The paperwork he needs has already been submitted to him by the Joel Council.

The trustees of the Joel Council are looking into how to change the signage of the church. All changes must be made by May 8th. Questions have been asked about the cross and flame logo. After May 7th this church will no longer be allowed to use the logo in any way...except...if it is a part of the structure of the building, for example on the cornerstone. The United Methodist hymnals can still be used because anyone can go on Cokesbury site and order a hymnal for use in any church. The hymnal can be used by other denominations.

On May 7th (maybe the next day since that is a Sunday), the church would need to send payment to the Annual Conference for the full amount of the disaffiliation. At this time, the latest figure is about **\$108,000**. It has gone down from about \$260,000. We do not anticipate it going down any more and are working with the conference office to make sure of any other surprises. We have just heard from the Conference Trustees that they are attaching a \$750 fee for legal fees to disaffiliating churches. In essence, we will not have the final number for disaffiliation until the Conference Trustees meet and vote on the final # for our church. It will be around \$108,000.

So far we have gotten a little money trickling in designated for the disaffiliation fund. If you would like to give to it, earmark your check.

There is a process and still a road to travel...please, let's work together to see it through.

After May 7th the church can no longer be called Robertsdale United Methodist Church.

Members have been submitting name ideas into the basket in Connection Cove. A list of the possible names that have been submitted is listed. The Joel Council has appointed a committee to narrow down the name choices (or come up with a new name altogether) to **3**. **February 19th,** after the morning worship service, the church members will vote on the 3 names. 2 votes will be taken. The first vote will eliminate one of the 3 names and the second vote will choose between the 2 remaining names. You must be present to vote.

The process is happening pretty quickly because the new name has to be on the legal documents which need to go to the lawyer and submitted to the State of Alabama before the paperwork for disaffiliation is submitted to the conference by **March 15th.**


Kids JAM
