**Being the Hands and Feet of Jesus** 

To be described as the "hands and feet of Jesus" is to embrace a life of active service, boundless compassion, and unwavering commitment to lifting others up. This phrase, rooted in Christian tradition, calls on believers to physically manifest Christ's love through their words, actions, and attitudes. While Jesus is not physically present on earth, those who follow Him are invited to continue His mission, embodying His spirit through deeds of kindness, acts of justice, and selfless giving. The journey to becoming the hands and feet of Jesus is both challenging and profoundly rewarding; it is a daily invitation to step beyond comfort, to see others with empathy, and to bring hope where it is most needed.

The expression "being the hands and feet of Jesus" is not found verbatim in Scripture, yet it is deeply rooted in biblical themes. Throughout the New Testament, Jesus commands his disciples to love one another, care for the poor, heal the sick, and serve without expecting anything in return. In Matthew 25:40, Jesus says, "Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me." This teaching encapsulates the heart of Christian service: to serve others is to serve Christ himself. When believers strive to be the hands and feet of Jesus, they commit to becoming living expressions of His compassion. The hands symbolize work, action, and the tangible efforts made to address the needs of others. The feet symbolize movement, journeying into unknown places, and a willingness to go wherever love is required. Together, they represent a holistic approach to faith—one that is not content with passive belief but is ignited by purposeful, loving action.

We saw such action on full display this past week at Grace Community Church during Vacation Bible School. Adult and youth volunteers committed their time, energy, and effort to serve however was needed so that the children of our church and community could learn about and come in contact with the God who loves them and made them in His image. Some served in the kitchen, providing food and drink and cleaning up after the children, others taught classes, helped with music, arts and crafts, or a host of other tasks. These roles may have felt unimportant or small in nature, but each of them were necessary and contributed to a bigger and meaningful goal: showing our kids the way to eternal life and helping them build a solid faith foundation. Because these volunteers chose to be the hands and feet of Jesus this past week, nearly eighty children were shown the love of God and had the Gospel of Jesus Christ shared with them. This is what's it's all about, and what we're all about at Grace Community! Thank you to everyone who played a role in making this year's VBS such a huge success! For those who weren't able to serve at VBS this year, how might you be the hands and feet of Jesus today? This week? This month? This year? How might you serve, show mercy, kindness, the love of God, and compassion, in such a way that it puts people in the presence of God? If you intend to follow Jesus, these are questions worth asking yourself and revisiting often. Grace and Peace,
